Together Time Activities

Here are some fun activities you and your child can enjoy together!

• Visit a Farmers Market

Visit a farmers market together this summer. As you walk through the market, talk about the fruits, vegetables, meats, and other products being sold. Talk with your child about the shapes and colors of foods. Encourage your child to help count out produce as you are bagging it for purchase.

• Play Ball

Take a ball outside and help your child discover many different ways to play with it. Try rolling it, tossing it, and kicking it. Roll it down a slide! Toss it into a box. What other ways can you play with the ball?

Sand Fun

Place some sand in a plastic tub and invite your child to explore. Use a finger to draw a triangle or other shapes in the sand. See if your child will imitate. Offer a large spoon and some containers. Your child can fill the containers with the spoon or pour sand from container to container.

Pretend to Grill

Lay a metal rack over an open cardboard box to create a make-believe grill. Offer your child some cardboard circles, child-safe cooking tools, and other props for pretend grilling. Get ready to enjoy an imaginary feast!
